A number of issues were debated at the Joint Area Committee meeting held on 9 January, the most important being the establishing of a Focus Group by Basildon Council to consider all aspects of the Local Plan and arrangements were made for representation from the BDRA. Planning applications were considered, most especially those which appeared in contravention of building regulations and objections were agreed for transmission to Basildon Council. The issue of vehicles travelling in excess of local speed limits was also of concern and Rosebay Avenue was mentioned where a fatality had occurred in 2022. The introduction of additional speed cameras was suggested to enforce a request for a 20mph zone by the Town Council in the area of the School.

During 2023, the BDRA will conduct a survey of the High Street and residents' views will be sought via a questionnaire, details of which will appear in this magazine.

Grimshill Wood

n late November 2022 we had a tip-off from the Billericay Action Group (BAG) that the 9.5 acre privately owned Grimshill Wood on Green Belt was to be on the market at auction for £90,000 but subsequently went under the hammer for £152,000.

A price way below its value for residential development we are informed. The land had not been included in the now withdrawn but to be revised Local Plan for development. The Wood borders the southeast side of the Outwood Common Road and is sandwiched between a housing estate and farmland. The Wood is relatively young as the site's topsoil was removed ready for residential development many years ago but construction never went ahead. The existing Wood is a good example as to how a vacant plot of land left to its own devices goes through a process of ecological succession until woodland dominates from grasses, herbaceous plants, shrubs to scrub and finally to trees -Demonstrating the resilience of nature bouncing back when given a chance; natural regeneration. The BTW contacted BBC Planning and requested that the Wood be served a Woodland Order (TPO) so to safeguard its future. The good news is that our Borough Council agreed and quickly set in motion the legal TPO

protection process. We wait to see if the Wood will be looked after for its ecological value or will it be turned into an entrepreneurial business venture (paintball etc.) that if not sensitively managed could be to its ecological detriment. There are some serious examples in the area where the latter has occurred. An ideal solution is where a Wood is bought to practice woodland crafts and to improve the Wood for wildlife biodiversity with the intention to leave it in a better condition than when first acquired. We wait to see the Wood's fate. Meanwhile the Wood is contributing to the fresh air that our town's "Green Lung" provides us all with.

The BTW is a subgroup of the Billericay Town Council.



NORSEY WOOD IN SPRING

The eagle eyed among you will have already spotted that the bluebells are coming along nicely, but what else is happening in the wood now that the days are longer and warmer? Here are three things to look out for when you visit Norsey Wood.

March sees a dense carpet of low growing plants with beautiful white flowers, sometimes tinged with pink. These are our wood anemones, which are a marker of ancient woodlands such as ours, and Norsey Wood has them in abundance.

By now, preparation for the breeding season is well underway for our resident birds and you will see them pairing up and searching for suitable nest sites. Aside from the great and blue tits, robins and dunnocks who stay with us through the winter, you may be lucky enough to spot some of our migrant visitors, such as the Chiff-chaffs and blackcaps, which are among the first to arrive.

As the days and nights warm up and more insects become available, bats will emerge from hibernation and come out to feed. Look up and along the tree lines for them just after sunset.

Our day begins in Ipswich and it is market day, you will have free time to explore before we journey on to Earsham Hall. We will be going behind the closed doors of "stately" home Earsham Hall, where the owner of the property will be our tour guide and will go to great lengths, to explain the history of the house. Earsham Hall is one of finest country mansion houses in Norfolk. It has a rich and varied history dating back to the 15th century a large Queen Anne house with medieval origins. From 1948 until 1973 it was let as a Boarding and Day school for boys. In 1973 the financial and political pressure was too great and the school closed down. Today running it with his wife Annabel and shared with their children Oliver and Sophie. The Hall itself is also home to the extended Derham family and incorporates three generations under one roof.
