





Any of you may know that the Conservatives held control of Basildon Council as a result of the May local ward elections. They retain a majority with 25 seats over the combined Labour and Independents with 17 seats. But what does this mean when it comes to the Local Plan?

Back in March the previous Conservative administration took the bold step to withdraw the proposed new Local Plan, citing issues with large scale Green Belt loss and high rise developments in Basildon town centre as their primary reasons for doing so. We had been consistently calling for the Local Plan to be withdrawn for the last year so this was seen as a major achievement and a step in the right direction. We still find ourselves in a somewhat uncertain position but we are buoyed by the fact that with the Conservatives in administration they should deliver on their earlier promises to come up with a better Local Plan, and involve local people more comprehensively and positively in the creation of the plan.

Furthermore, the Government, through Bills proposed in the Queens speech in May, are expected to make some important changes to the planning system which will allow councils to come up with Local Plans based on lower housing targets where valid constraints such as the Green Belt exist. This is crucial and it's important that our councillors heed this as excessive housing numbers have always been at the heart of our bad and damaging Local Plan in the past.

Please be assured that we will continue the fight for a good Local Plan. One that delivers what local people really need, is sustainable with appropriate infrastructure and protects the environment. We will do all we can to influence the new administration and hold councillors and council officers to account with 4 major themes:-

- **1** A housing target that is based on local need not perceived national demand
- **2** Protecting the existing Green Belt and our irreplaceable open spaces, and recognising such land as a constraint to development
- **3** Giving housing priority to local people and delivering affordable properties of the right type in the right places
- **4** Ensuring that infrastructure to support housing is delivered first and completely

Additionally, we will be insisting that the existing Local Plan continues to be used to inform all planning decisions until the new Local Plan is adopted, and that the current Green Belt is protected in the short term from speculative development.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

SOLAR FARM

The BDRA have submitted their concerns to Basildon Council about the latest Planning Application highlighting the unnecessary development in the Green Belt and a range of other issues including the loss of agricultural land and potential visual impact.

REIDS and The Fold

Members will have seen suggestions in the press about developments of flats at Reids

on Laindon Road and possible implications for the Fold Arts Centre. At present no Planning Application has been submitted to Basildon Council and to the best of our knowledge any changes are far from finalised. Whilst access to The Fold is through the Reids site, the buildings are separate and have different owners. The Fold plays home to over 20 local groups and provides facilities otherwise not available in the town. BDRA will be keeping a close

eye on developments which might affect The Fold and we will bring more news in future editions of The Resident.

Dementia Care Home Pipps Hill Road North

Plans for a dementia care home on Pipps Hill Road North in Billericay have been rejected by Basildon Borough Council. Issues following building in a green belt area, a lack of accessibility and highway safety, and noise from the building work were reportedly cited as reasonable objections to the proposal.

HSBC High Street

Billericay and Basildon's MP John Baron is currently working on a campaign to retain the Billericay HSBC bank branch, following announcements of its closure this year. Mr Baron has been in contact with the Chief Executive of the bank pleading for them to change the decision, and we are awaiting further updates.

Leaving a gift to a charity in your will

harities often rely on gifts made under a deceased's will to keep the charity afloat financially, as most charities do not receive government or lottery funding, and anyone can leave a gift to a charity/charities under their will.

When executing your will, you can leave details of the name, postal address and charity number of the charity/charities that you would like to inherit part of your estate. You can either leave the charity a fixed sum or a percentage of your estate.

What are the inheritance tax implications of leaving your estate to charity?

Did you know that any donation to a charity left under your will, will be taken off the value of your estate before inheritance tax is calculated.

How do you make sure it counts as a charity?

It is always worth double checking that the charity is a registered charity with the Charity Commission, to

ensure that it is a reputable organisation. Their website is https://www.gov.uk/find-charity-information

Could a gift cause friction with your family?

Whilst some family members may be fine with you leaving a portion or whole of your estate to a charity, others may not be. If you are thinking about leaving a significant portion of your estate to a charity and not a loved one, then it is important to document this decision, to try and avoid an expensive legal dispute arising after your death.

Can I specify how the charity uses my money?

You can include in your will stipulations as to what your gift is used for, but it is always best to discuss your wishes with the charity directly first.

Platinum Jubilee of HM Queen Elizabeth II



ur gardeners have been pleased to create a design on the raised bed in the gardens this summer, which is dedicated to Her Majesty The Queen and the 70 years of loyal service she has given to this country. The majority of us have only ever known one monarch during our lives, although some of us can remember her Coronation in June 1953, when we remember the Queen of Tonga in her open carriage in the rain. Our parents planted red, white and blue flowers in our front gardens and decorated the street with union flags and bunting. How exciting it was to watch the Coronation on one of those tiny black & white TVs; the first television many of us had seen.

That year had begun with a terrible disaster on the night January 31st. Around of midnight a depression moved down the east coast causing tidal wave that а overwhelmed Canvey Island. The boats from Lake Meadows were evidently taken to Canvey to help evacuate people.

There was a coronation pageant at the park, which had to be postponed a few days due to the inclement weather. Over 400 people took part with 2,000 watching the spectacle and one group of citizens dressed as characters from previous times.

Even a few years ago, their off-spring would visit each Spring. Recently they have disappeared, to be relaced by a pair of great crested grebes

about this time, who regularly nested at the Perry Street gate corner amongst the water lilies. who regularly build their nest and can be seen carrying the young around on their backs.

We are fortunate to see so many different birds and waterfowl living here or visiting the park. As always there are lots of young Canada Geese goslings, Moorhens and Coots.
