BDRA NEWS



Thanks to the actions of the BDRA Sun Corner will remain into perpetuity an area for local people to enjoy, its status denying any incursions by property developers. Following some investigative work by John Buchanan, a former Chair of the BDRA, he discovered that application could be made for the site to become a Queen Elizabeth II playing field. This was achieved in 2012.

At the recent JAC meeting, mention was made of a proposal to erect a local memorial to Queen Elizabeth II and it was thought fitting that Sun Corner should be among the sites considered.

The JAC will continue to monitor the changes in the High Street following the closure of most of the banks in the town. Consideration is also being given to the introduction of a High Street survey using the new facebook page from which opinions of residents can be gauged as to how they would like to see their High Street going forward.

Whilst the draft Local Plan was withdrawn by Basildon Council earlier in the year some of the sites in that Plan were, or subsequently have been, the subject of separate Planning Applications. All of those in the Billericay area have been rejected, primarily for being in the protected Green Belt. Some appeals have been raised, including one related to the Kennel Lane site where 200 houses were proposed. The results of these appeals will be closely monitored by the JAC. Other applications for planning permission were scrutinized and objections were raised where thought necessary.

Further information was received regarding the situation of the garages in Salesbury Drive on land owned by Waltham Forest Council. Local residents have met and have recorded their deep concern regarding the condition and safety of the site. The JAC has alerted Councillor Schrader.

On a lighter note, the JAC members were pleased to learn that Christmas lights would once more bring a sparkle to the High Street.

Developments at The Fold

The Fold Arts Centre provides facilities for a number of local community groups, some of which would be impracticable if permanent facilities were not available.

In previous editions we have reported on suspected plans for the redevelopment of Reids, the complex adjacent to the Fold, and the subsequent fire at Reids.

A formal Planning Application has now been submitted for the development of 35 flats on the Reids building site and the adjacent car park.

In principle The Fold would not appear to be materially affected by the proposed development. However, many BDRA members attend the Fold and already know the parking problems which currently exist if several groups are present at the same time. The signs put up by Reids threatening dire consequences for Fold users who stray into the Reids car park are testament to the problems.

The BDRA is concerned that the new developments will significantly worsen access and parking conditions at the Fold, and given the recent experience of conflagration may even increase the risk for the Arts Centre, nursery and commercial users of The Fold.





The BDRA believes this would be a perfect opportunity for Basildon Council and our elected councillors to balance the commercial aspirations of a local business, the profit aspirations of the chosen developer and the improvement needs of a local community asset to make this a location which brings benefits to all sectors of the community instead of a plan which merely worsens the facilities available to residents.

BILLERICAY MAYFLOWER ROTARY ON COURSE FOR ANOTHER BRILLIANT CHRISTMAS MARKET

Plans are already well under way for Billericay Christmas Market 2022. This hugely popular, free event takes place on Sunday 4 December, and heralds the start of the Christmas season in Billericay, with over 150 stalls, ranging from craft Christmas decorations to craft beer!



The High Street will be closed to traffic for the day, so that families can enjoy festive entertainment and Christmas shopping: many of the High Street shops will remain open for what is always one of their most successful days. Led by a pipe band, dancers, and circus acts, Santa's parade starts at 11am and will launch the event organised for the eleventh year by Billericay Mayflower Rotarians supported by their team of "Big Eventers", and colleagues from other local clubs.



A utumn is turning at the park and putting on her amazing coloured cloak. Wonder as you wander around the paths, see the Liquid Amber trees in golden leaf at the crossroads above the Garden of the Child, the nearby red oak and copper beech and the maples and cornus plants at the far end of the lake. One bush in particular celebrates autumn with its blaze of red – look out for the Euonymus Alatus, the Burning Bush or Winged Spindle tree, an unusual shrub with almost triangular twigs.

The gardeners have been busy planting hundreds more bulbs throughout the garden areas and by now they will have planted out over 600 winter bedding plants too. The team will be finally tidying the park for winter, when they have a wellearned break and hang up their tools until February.

Help plant the next generation of woodland this December

Two working parties will be taking place to improve the woodland before the winter comes.

First, a group of volunteers will be cutting back the scrub holly, which is fast growing and needs trimming back to keep paths and ditches clear and allow other woodland flora to spread – look out for the date!

Secondly, on **December 8th at 10am**, a joint working party will plant hundreds of tree whips in the area near the fir trees, at the top of the hill on the north-east

Street entertainers and flash mobs from local dance schools will help to provide the party atmosphere and there is a fairground for young visitors, not forgetting the wide range of food and drinks on offer.

Mayflower's Event Manager David Randall said: "The Market is a big, FREE attraction for the town's families, and for folk coming in by bus, train, and car from surrounding areas.
